Sanction is hereby accorded to the constitution of District Skill Committees (DSC), comprising the following, to ensure quality, consistency and convergence in the skill ecosystem of the District, besides generating awareness of various initiatives launched by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India:-



The Committees shall work as District level focal points and local facilitator for ensuring and sustaining skill nourishing initiatives at the district level. The broad areas of activities of the committees shall be as under:-

- Asses the nature and magnitude of the skill gap across the districts and suggest appropriate measures in terms of vocational or other training to bridge the gap.
- Generate awareness among the unemployed youth about the industry demand for various vocations/trades, project future demand of industry at district level and suggest/explore


methods in order to increase livelihood opportunities across the districts and facilitate enhanced job creation.

- iii. Review the Infrastructure, machinery available with various vocational training providers engaged in implementing Central and State Government schemes (like Government and Private ITIs, PMKVY and PMKK centers, NSDC centers etc.) across the District.
- iv. Coordinate the efforts of various Government Departments and Industry in the District for building and nurturing a valuable skill base having regard to the local art, crafts and trade.
- v. Training and creating a pool of trainers in various trades across the districts to facilitate the implementation of various skill development initiatives of the Central and State Government.
- vi. Exploring and making use of Satellite Base District Learning (SBDL) Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) and other digital technology to facilitate and enable improvement of learning outcome of the training.
- vii. Mentoring and nurturing of new and relevant vocational institutes by seeking inputs from the local labour market of the District and proposing appropriate course designs in consultation with other vocational institutes especially ITIs.
- viii. Organizing and providing infrastructure and other facilities for facilitating placement of skilled youth in job melas to be organized in the Districts.
- ix. Organizing and conducting counselling sessions for skilled youth and vocational graduates of the district with regard to awareness of various schemes and programmes of the Central and State Government and the process of registration on portals like National Career Services (NCS) portal, Labour Market Information System (LMIS) portal.
- x. Organizing convocations for vocational graduates across the District to ushering them a sense of pride and accomplishment thereby encouraging the concept of self employment.
- xi. Generating awareness about financial incentives and schemes available for financing of local entrepreneurship.
- xii. Monitoring progress of various apprenticeship schemes and ensuring convergence of funds from various Central and State schemes for improving the skill ecosystem.



It is further ordered that the Director, Technical Education, J&K shall designate the best ITI of each district as District Nodal Skill Centre (DNSC) and the Principal/Superintendent of the said ITI shall act as convener of the DNSC. The DNSC will be responsible for coordinating all the skill development related activities of the District and shall also provide secretarial assistance to the District Skill Committee.
